Title: *Smart and Intelligent Learning in Education - SmILE*

City, province and country: District Peshawar, Province Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan

Project duration: 36 Months (1st May, 2021 to 30th April, 2024)

HOPE'87 is looking for individuals, teams or firms with expertise in Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) to undertake the Project End Review (PER) of the project "Smart and Intelligent Learning in Education" in district Peshawar of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. ***The deadline for submitting the application is Thursday 27th February, 2024.***

1. BACKGROUND

The education system in the public sector school is based on the 'rote' learning and does not prepare the children/students to 21st century skills. As a result, the learning outcomes are poor among students and not in pace with the rapid technology developments and weak competitiveness at the international level. One of the primary disadvantages to rote memory is that it doesn't allow for a deeper understanding of the subject. Only the bare facts of a subject such as a vocabulary or multiplication tables are memorized or understood. Rote learning also does not allow for complex connections between previous and new knowledge. It can also be very difficult to understand a concept by only using rote memory truly. The current teaching and learning methods result in weak to poor students' skills, attitudes, values and knowledge, and thus does not provide them with the skills needed for the development of lifelong learning.

The education system does not provide students with various forms of teaching and learning opportunities, including blended learning, group and individual class work, and field (out-of-classroom) activities. As a result, the students lack the 21st century skills such as self-learning, team work, communication, critical thinking, problem solving, research and discovery, and creativity to expand their capacity to deal with the surrounding world and with contemporary technologies.

One big reason the learning crisis persists is that the education system in Pakistan has little information on who is learning and who is not. The teachers and school heads/principals lack the tools to assess the level of learning of concepts, skills and knowledge retained by the students and learners at the end of each class session. This results in inequalities in learning among the students that are only highlighted at the mid-year or year-end examinations and tests.

There is absolute lack of a systemic approach to both teachers and children accessing content which ranges from teaching materials, explanatory videos, interactive content, stories, practice worksheets, and formative assessments. Lack of monitoring content that is used most frequently—and most beneficially—informed decisions cannot be made around future content.

HOPE'87 is implementing the project in district Peshawar, province Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The duration of the project is 36 Months (1st May, 2021 – 30th April, 2024).

The **Principal objective** of the project is to contribute to the achievement of inclusive and equitable quality education and promotion of lifelong learning opportunities for all (SDGs 4, 5 and 10) in Pakistan.

The **Specific objective** is to improve higher order thinking and science learning among secondary school students through blended online learning with face-to-face instruction (SDG targets 4.1, 4.4, 4.5, 4.6, 4.7, 4.a and 4.c, 5.1 and 5.b, 10.2) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province.

The **project results** are;

Result 1: Blended learning solutions are introduced in 24 schools for secondary education levels (SDG targets 4.1, 4.4, 4.5, 4.6, 4.7, 4.a and 4.c, 5.1 and 5.b, 10.2).

Result 2: Blended Learning Methods using the “Learn Smart Classroom” tool available and in use among children in grades 6 to 8 at target schools (50% girls schools) (SDG targets 4.1, 4.4, 4.5, 4.6, 4.7, 4.a and 4.c, 5.1 and 5.b, 10.2)

Direct beneficiaries: At least 8,746 youth will benefit from the action.

2. PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT END REVIEW

The **Project End Review** will assess relevance, effectiveness, efficiency, coordination, sustainability, of the project. The aim of this Project End Review will be to identify strengths and weaknesses that could be used to improve similar actions in the future.

- During project implementation, to what extent was the project successful in achieving the specific objective “to improve higher order thinking and science learning among secondary school students through blended online learning with face-to-face instruction”.
- What are the key internal and external factors that have contributed/hindered such achievements during project implementation? (identify the opportunities and constraints under SWOT of the project)?
- How far the mainstreaming of gender was ensured during project implementation?

c) Efficiency

- To what extent, the action achieved the planned outputs?
- To what extent inclusive approaches were made part of implementation; what challenges and barriers were faced and the respective mitigation measures taken?
- What kind of gender sensitive measures were taken, i.e. how girls were supported to equally participate in the project, given the predominant inequality described in the proposal and what has been done to combat the proportionally higher drop-out rate of girls etc.?
- To what extent did the project staff use mitigating measures to overcome new challenges and needs during the project implementation?

- To what extent will the trained teachers and school principals (trained on blended learning model) would able to continue implementing and exercising the learned skills and knowledge after the project?

- The consultant(s) shall be fluent in English, Urdu and preferably in the local language (Pashto).
- Shall have women team member to interact with girls.
- Be paid an agreed amount for the Project End Review including the Project End Review report.
- ***During assignment and visits to project location (district Peshawar), HOPE'87 offices in Islamabad and Peshawar, stay and travel will be under his/her responsibility and part of the lump sum payment.***
- Takes own liability for security risks related to the service.
